ANOINTING OF THE SICK MASS will be celebrated on **Saturday, October 18, at 10:00 a.m.**, at Good Shepherd Church. If you would like to be anointed, please call the parish office at 761-1167 by **Wednesday, October 15**. Transportation will be provided for those who need it and there will be people at church, including medical personnel, to provide assistance if needed. Those who wish to be anointed (or a relative or friend) are asked to call the parish office, before **October 5**. **Who can be anointed?** Anyone who has a serious or chronic illness, is infirm due to old age, is scheduled to undergo surgery, and those suffering from mental disorders may be anointed. **If I was anointed before, can I be anointed again?** If a new illness has developed or there has been a relapse during the same illness, a person can be anointed again. **Do you have to be a certain age to be anointed?** Any baptized Catholic, who has sufficient use of reason, can be anointed. **Is this the sacrament that was referred to as Extreme Unction or the Last Rites?** Yes it is, however, since the Second Vatican Council the emphasis of this sacrament is the healing of the mind, body and spirit of sick persons and is not reserved only for the dying.
