FAITHFUL CITIZENSHIP

*A Catholic Call to Political Responsibility
A Statement by the Administrative Committee of the United States
Conference of Catholic Bishops*

We urge our fellow citizens "to see beyond party politics, to analyze campaign, rhetoric critically, and to choose their political leaders according to principle, not party affiliation or mere self-interest."¹¹ (U.S.C.C.B., *Living the Gospel of Life*, no. 34). As bishops, we seek to form the consciences of our people. We do not wish to instruct persons on how they should vote by endorsing or opposing candidates. We hope that voters will examine the position of candidates on the full range of issues, as well as on their personal integrity, philosophy, and performance. We are convinced that a consistent ethic of life should be the moral framework from which to address issues in the political arena.¹² (Cf. Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, *Doctrinal Note on Some Questions Regarding the Participation of Catholics in Political Life*, no. 4).

Blazing the Trail: Asset Renewal Plan On October 1 at Back-to-School Night at Trinity High School, a long-range *Asset Renewal Plan* was presented to the parents. Trinity High School is the first Catholic school in the Diocese to invest in a long-range *Asset Renewal Plan*. The study provides a tool to protect and renew the physical assets (i.e. building, systems, property) of the school and includes an assessment of the current condition of all major assets, the remaining useful life, and the estimated replacement cost. The Trinity High School Board of Directors, comprised of the Pastors and lay representatives from each parish served by Trinity, will consider recommendations as to the funding of the *Asset Renewal Plan* following meetings with architects, engineers, and other professionals in the construction field, the Trinity High School Development Board, and consultation with Diocesan officials.

A summary of Trinity High School's income and expenses for year ending June 30, 2008 was also reported. A total of \$3,956,857 was received; 75% of which came from tuition and fees; 19% from parish subsidies, and 6% from fundraising and other income. Expenditures for that same year totaled \$3,880,447; 78% of which went to salaries and benefits; 9% for heat, electricity, and other services, and the remaining 13% for supplies, maintenance and transportation. In addition to these expenditures, resurfacing of the parking lot was completed at a cost of \$146,000.

The actual cost to educate each student in 2008-2009 is \$6,200. Non Catholic tuition is \$6,200. Catholic family tuition is as follows:

one student - \$4,550; **two** students - \$7,300;
three students - \$8,550.
