HELP NEEDED The SCRIP gift card program is looking for an additional volunteer to assist with the management of this Good Shepherd School program. When gift cards are purchased after Mass through the SCRIP Program, national and local retailers return a percentage of purchases to Good Shepherd School.

Also, the purchasing of gift cards earns 2% toward Good Shepherd tuition vouchers. For example, purchasing \$1,000 worth of gift cards would earn a \$20 tuition credit. It is not uncommon for families to receive \$200-\$500 in tuition savings per year with this program.

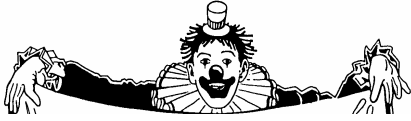
