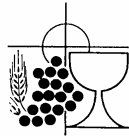

The Mass is the most powerful form of healing prayer. Please take this opportunity to remember your children, to name them if you have not, and to celebrate the fulfillment of God’s plan of having each human family incorporated into God’s spiritual family.

Action Alert: There is much discussion about federal health-care reform legislation. Congressional committees considering bills have rejected amendments that would provide conscience protection for mandatory abortion services as part of universal healthcare. Efforts are underway in Congress toward the most sweeping expansion of abortion since the decision in *Roe v. Wade*. In order to maintain freedom of conscience for healthcare providers and employers, it is important that you contact Senators Casey and Specter as well as your representatives in the U.S. Congress (go to www.house.gov and www.senate.gov for contact information). Tell them clearly that health-care reform should include coverage for all people from conception until natural death, should continue the federal ban on funding abortions or mandatory abortion coverage, and must protect freedom of conscience for providers, patients, and healthcare workers.
