Mental Illness Awareness Week In 1990, Congress proclaimed the first week of October as Mental Illness Awareness Week. The National Catholic Partnership on Disability (NCPD) Council on Mental Illness has released it's new resource manual "*Welcomed and Valued: Building Faith Communities of Support and Hope with People with Mental Illness and Their Families.*" This manual can assist parishes in including persons with mental illness. The manual is available for free download on the NCPD website (www.ncpd.org). In addition, the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) has developed resources. The Diocesan Tribunal has a specific ministry to divorced persons who may wish to remarry in the Catholic Church. People approach the Tribunal from many different religious backgrounds, and for different reasons. Some wish to remarry soon; others seek closure to a prior marriage with no new marriage in mind; and others who are already remarried "outside of the church" now wish to be reconciled with the Catholic Church. Whatever the reason, the Tribunal is ready to assist any divorced person who may wish to remarry in the Catholic Church or to help any divorced and remarried Catholic who wishes to return to the reception of the sacraments but is prevented from doing so because of a prior marriage.
