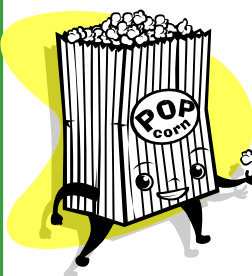
Good Shepherd Knights of Columbus 10685 Recruitment Sunday OCTOBER 17, 18, 2009

The Diocesan Tribunal has a specific ministry to divorced persons who may wish to remarry in the Catholic Church. People approach the Tribunal from many different religious backgrounds, and for different reasons. Some wish to remarry soon; others seek closure to a prior marriage with no new marriage in mind; and others who are already remarried "outside of the church" now wish to be reconciled with the Catholic Church. Whatever the reason, the Tribunal is ready to assist any divorced person who may wish to remarry in the Catholic Church or to help any divorced and remarried Catholic who wishes to return to the reception of the sacraments but is prevented from doing so because of a prior marriage.
