World Youth Day Madrid 2011 Bishop Kevin Rhoades invites the youth of the diocese, ages 16-30, to join him at ***World Youth Day 2011*** from **August 10 to 22, 2011**, in Madrid, Spain. The spiritual pilgrimage will include a two-day retreat experience in Lourdes, a brief visit to Loyola, an overnight in Burgos, and the World Youth Day activities in Madrid. The approximate cost will be \$3,000. A non-refundable \$350 deposit is due by December. Quarterly payments of \$400 will begin January 15, 2010. Payment in full by April 15, 2011.
