HAITI DISASTER We have collected \$24,685.00 to date. What an overwhelming response without much notice! You may continue to send in a donation for the earthquake victims.

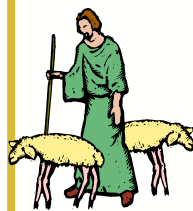
THE GOOD SHEPHERD CHURCH ADVOCACY PROGRAM

GOOD HAPPENINGS FROM GOOD SHEPHERD SCHOOL

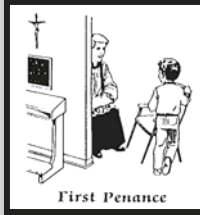
