DEDICATORY HONORS for two Bishops of Harrisburg who had significant influence in the life and history of Good Shepherd Parish were announced at the Closing Ceremony of Solemn Eucharistic Devotions on Tuesday evening. After consulting the Pastoral Council and speaking with the School Board, Father Helwig announced that the Parish Hall will be dedicated to the Memory of Bishop Dattilo. The Cross (from the top of the tower on the original Market Street Church/School would be erected on the Education Center property and dedicated to Bishop Kevin Rhoades, who played such an important role in Catholic Education in the parish and diocese. These two dedicatory honors will acknowledge the contribution of the two bishops that benefited our parish.

March 5 marked the Anniversary of Bishop Dattilo's death and the 5th Anniversary of the Blessing of the Parish Hall by Bishop Rhoades in 2005.

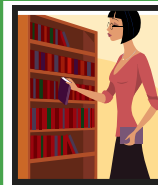

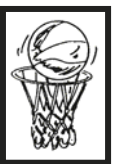
