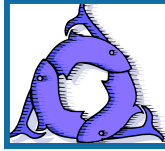

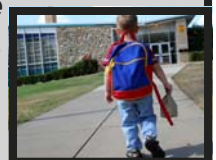
Please keep Bennett Smith and Chris Pillion in your prayers as they continue to prepare and raise funds for World Youth Day 2011 in Spain.

Student from Mainland China to Attend Trinity High School Forte International Exchange Association in Washington, DC, is currently seeking a loving host family in the Camp Hill area for one male student from China, attending Trinity High School for the **2010-2011** school year. He is an international student, studying in the United States on an F-1 educational visa. During his stay in the US, he will be fully covered with medical and accident insurance and will have his own spending money for school supplies, clothing and extras. A little detail on the student: Bin Hong is 18, and will be going into the 11th grade in the fall at Trinity H.S. in Camp Hill. He also enjoys going to the theater, listening to popular music and watching movies. In school, history is his favorite subject and he's particularly interested in America's past. Bin is looking forward very much to having the opportunity to live and study in Pennsylvania and to absorb western culture, something which he has had only limited exposure to up to this point.

Hosting an international student can be a heart-warming and eye-opening experience for the whole family. Their presence in your home will help to foster better relations between China and the United States. Anyone can participate—single parents, couples with no children, "empty nesters," etc. Please take advantage of this opportunity to learn about another culture, while at the same time sharing your own. You will have the opportunity to represent America as a grass-roots ambassador; the influences you have on an international student will be taken back to their home country and spread around to others not fortunate enough to visit the United States.
