YOUNG ADULT PARISH REGISTRATION

In the normal course of things, children are registered in a parish census with their parents. Many times, however, when the children become adults, move away from home, and establish their own lives, they continue to be carried on their parents’ registration in their childhood parish, when in fact they may be living in another location. Once a young adult establishes his/her own “life situation” (i.e. residence, employment, etc.), he or she should register individually in the local parish where they live, whether here or elsewhere.

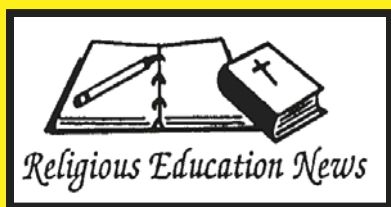

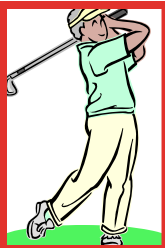
